The March 25 meeting minutes were provided to each Council member prior to the meeting. Mr. Wannemacher made a motion to approve as written, seconded by Mr. Honigford. A vote of five yeses passed this motion.

Mr. Honigford moved to approve bills presented for payment (see register attached), seconded by Mrs. Zeller. A vote of five yeses passed this motion.

Welcomed guests, Micky Font, Peachy Nutrition and Michelle Hanneman, Wannemacher's Tavern

- Discussion about bringing DORA (Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area) to the village.
- Council is on board with the idea.
- Ms. Hanneman will speak with the Ottoville Chamber of Commerce at their next meeting. Ms. Font and Ms. Hanneman would like to form a committee to help things moving.

## Fire Department

- Insurance Committee met with the VFIS agent to discuss the following:
  - VFIS Property & liability insurance
    - Increased 4% for the annual cost of \$8550.
    - Could increase deductible to lower premium; this will be up to the townships.
    - Fiscal Officer will forward information to Fire Board for their review at the July meeting.
    - Mr. Wannemacher made a motion to approve this coverage, seconded by Mrs. Petrick. A vote of five yeses passed this motion.
  - VFIS Accident & Sickness
    - Can provide life insurance to the firefighters while off duty.
      - Possibly help draw in more volunteers and keep current.
    - Fiscal Officer will forward information to Fire Board for their review at the July meeting.

## BPA presented by Fiscal Officer

- Reviewed quote for Well #4 rehab.
  - a. This is preventative maintenance; 13 years since last pm.
  - b. Utility guys will monitor but feel it's ok to wait another year.
  - c. Add to 2025 budget.
- Mr. Knippen will obtain quotes for tuckpoints on the block at the water treatment plant.
  - a. This may need to be fixed prior to painting.
- Reviewed Liquid Engineering recommendations for the 100K and 200K water maintenance.
  - a. Mostly preventative maintenance: don't feel anything is critical.
    - i. The concrete base may need to be looked at on the 100K tower. Mr. Knippen will obtain quotes.
  - b. Will table until May's meeting to give everyone a little more time to review.

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- PSI is constructing a new building this spring.
  - a. Water & sewer taps are needed; water tap possibly 8 10."
- EJP is discontinuing their relationship with Sensus but assured village we will be able to continue reading and billing.
  - a. All village meters are Sensus.
  - b. May need to explore meter change out options for the entire village in next 3-5 years. Most meters have been in use for 20 plus years.
- The West Canal waterline between Third and Fifth Street needs replaced. The Street Department would like to pave this area in 2025 so will need to look into finance options.

#### Police

- Eclipse, over all went well.
  - o Traffic did increase but not substantially.
  - o Number of people in the park from out of state.

## Fiscal Officer (FO)

- Updated council on ongoing unemployment fraud dating back to February 2023. AOS working with the FO to correct.
- The current expenses tax levy will expire at the end of 2024.
  - o Mr. Honigford made a motion to do a replacement levy for five years seconded by Mr. Buss. A vote of five yeses passed this motion.
  - FO will forward paperwork to Mr. Buchholz for final review and have ready for approval at the May council meeting.

### New & Unfinished Business

- Tax Review Board
  - Could not find a 3<sup>rd</sup> member, will continue with two members.
  - Mrs. Petrick made a motion to approve Kathy Wurst as a member of the Tax Review Board, seconded by Mr. Honigford. A vote of five yeses passed this motion.
  - Mrs. Zeller made a motion to approve Matt Wannemacher as a member of the Tax Review Board, seconded by Mrs. Petrick. A vote of five yeses passed this
  - Tax Ordinance 2023-02 needs to be updated with a correction. FO will contact the tax administrator to address.
- Mrs. Petrick moved to pass the third reading of Ordinance 2024-01, An Ordinance providing for health care fund, reimbursement of out-of-pocket medical expenses, providing for monthly payment for full-time employees in certain cases and repealing Ordinance # 226, 233, 243, 260, and 278, seconded by Mr. Buss. Roll Call Vote: Zeller, yes; Wannemacher, yes; Honigford, yes; Petrick, yes; and Buss, yes.

- Clemans Nelson
  - o Mr. Moreno has not yet received a complete cost (changes, pdf, and hard copies) for the updates.
  - Area villages are looking to have Clemans Nelson update their policy manual as well and are having discrepancies with quoted costs and are getting conflicting information. We are part of a Putnam County Village Consortium with these villages and will need to look into what this entails. FO will follow up.
- Mrs. Petrick made a motion to approve the liquor licenses, seconded by Mr. Buss. A vote of five yeses passed this motion.
